Yesterday Pope Francis issued the *motu proprio, Traditionis custodes*, concerning guidelines for the celebration of the Traditional Latin Mass, also known as the Extraordinary Form.

Going forward, the Archdiocese of Boston will consult with the United States Conference of Bishops Committee on Divine Worship and our Archdiocesan Office for Divine Worship as we review the *motu proprio*.

With note that the Holy Father provided the local ordinary exclusive competence for use of the Extraordinary Form in his diocese, Cardinal O'Malley wishes to assure all the faithful of his concern for their spiritual and pastoral needs. In light of the pending consultations he is making no changes to the current practice.
